About the Program

This application was developed to more easily manage text files that Revit uses for its keynoting system. It is a simple user interface for editing these text files; it has no direct connection with Revit. It was created by Stephen Faust and is provided by Emc2 Group Architects Planners, PC as freeware under the terms and conditions below. These terms and conditions will be displayed the first time the program starts on any computer, and must be agreed to or the program will not start.

Getting Started

To begin using the Keynote Manager, simply download the .zip file from http://www.emc2architects.com/revit_tools.html and unzip it. Then move the 'Keynote Manager.exe' file to your desktop (or wherever you would like to access the program from) and double click it. Once you agree to the terms and conditions you will be taken to the main program. From there you can find additional instructions under the help menu or by pressing F1.

Features

- Allows viewing of keynote files in a stacked tree view rather than a very long list.
- Allows you to easily add, edit, or delete individual keynotes and their descriptions.
- Includes a "find" function that allows you to search for keynotes by any text contained in the description.
- Supports automatic casing of keynotes (or the option to turn off automatic casing).
 - Includes settings for automatically changing keynotes to upper case, lower case, or title case.
 - Includes tools to change individual keynotes, or all keynotes to upper case, lower case, or title case.
- Master keynote files can be defined (as many as desired).
 - New keynote files can be created using any defined master as a template.
 - A warning will be issued if a master keynote file is selected for editing.
- Allows multiple users to work on the same keynote file.
- Automatically creates up to 10 backups on each user's computer of each text file edited.
- Most commands are available via top menu, right click, or keyboard shortcut.
- Keynote Manager remembers its size and position from session to session.
- Includes optional system for reporting bugs or improvement ideas to Emc2.

Privacy

The Keynote Manager is not an installed application, so there is no uninstall available through windows. However, it does save a few files for purposes of settings and backups. All the files that are saved by the Keynote Manager will be saved at "C:\Documents and Settings*username*\Application Data\Keynote Manager". There should be up to 4 files (Keynote Manager.ini, License.txt, Masters.txt, & Recent.txt) and 1 folder of backups. The Keynote Manager folder and associated files will be present for each user that uses the Keynote Manager. The Keynote Manager will never send any information to Emc2 Group Architects Planners, PC or anyone else. The only communication is through the bug reporting system, which simply opens an email to the correct address and lets the user compose the email.

Updates and Bug Fix History

Version 5.0

- Initial public release (releases 1-4 are Emc2 internal releases).

Version 5.1

Fixed

- All files are now stored in application data & are environment variables. This fixes the error with 64 bit systems as well as removes the requirement for the user to have administrative permissions.*
- Shortcut keys for add sub and add sequential are no longer switched on the interface.
- Properly recognizes the difference between no keynote file and a blank keynote file.
- New keynote dialog now focuses on the description field if the keynote field has already been filled out.
- Stacks properly for lists with over 9 items (now works up to 999 items in series). Previously, long lists would number 1, 10, 11...19, 2, 20, etc.
- Add Sequential Sub-note now truly finds the end of the series, it doesn't just increment by one from the selected keynote.
- Converting case on a single keynote no longer improperly registers an external change to the file.
- Now ignores extra tab characters at the end of a line in the text file.
- Deleting a keynote while another delete is processing no longer hangs the program.
- The .ini file now follows ini file conventions so it can be edited by external editors.†
- Opening a file from the recent files menu no longer fails to create a backup file.

Added

- "Add Top Level Keynote" options have been added. This makes it more obvious how to add a new top level keynote as well as makes it possible to start with a blank file.
- File menu now contains an option to do directly to the "backups" folder.
- Single Keynote conversion functions have been added to the main keynote menu so that they are accessible there rather than only through the context menu.

* For those upgrading from version 5.0 please note that this change means that version 5.1 will not find your master lists or recent files from the last version. If you wish to preserve these, you can manually copy the files from C:\Program Files\Keynote Manager to C:\Documents and Settings*username*\Application Data\Keynote Manager.

† For those upgrading from version 5.0, please note that this change means that version 5.1 will not recognize the settings from previous versions, even if the ini file is copied to the correct location. While the program will not crash if the old .ini file is present, it is best to delete the old .ini if you copy old files to the new location.
